Option 8: 21 Day Namibia Classic Tour



Itinerary

Day 1: Flight to Namibia

Day 2: Arrive in Windhoek, transfer to Guestfarm

Lodge in the country not far from the airport
Relaxing afternoon on this rustic farm. After p.m coffee and cake we depart on a nature drive on this 5000 hectare wildlife reserve ending with a sundowner under a setting African sun

Day 3: Drive to the Kalahari semi-desert

Lodge in between the red sand dunes
Afternoon game drive in the Kalahari viewing a variety of animals. The many Camelthorn Trees are a dominant feature of this unique semi-desert paradise

Day 4: Drive via Keetmanshoop to the Fish River Canyon

Lodge at the Fish River Canyon. The unique southern Namib is home to a variety of interesting succulents and trees, including the Quiver Tree used by the local bushman to carry their bows and arrows

Day 5: Visit to the Fish River Canyon

Lodge at the Fish River Canyon, the second biggest Canyon in the world after the great Grand Canyon. A special area to take a walk and enjoy the magnificent views

Day 6: Drive along the Orange River bordering South Africa

Lodge in Aus. The Orange River flows through the beautiful Namaqualand area. This expansive untouched desert paradise is part of a new Transfrontier Park

Day 7: Drive to Sesriem/Sossusvlei

Lodge near the park entrance. We travel northwards along the great sand sea, one of the most scenic landscapes in Namibia. From our lodge we enjoy a view of the magnificent dune landscape. Visit to Sesriem Canyon

Day 8: Sossusvlei

Lodge in the Namib Desert
We depart as early as possible on a drive into this great sand sea. We continue to the famous Dead and Sossus Vleis to walk among the dunes and photograph this beautiful landscape. We may decide to climb one of the highest dunes in the world

Day 9: Via the Ghaub and Kuiseb Passes to Swakopmund

Overnight at a comfortable Hotel or guesthouse
Along the sand sea and over the gravel plains of the Namib, we continue to the cosy town of Swakopmund on the mighty Atlantic Ocean. We enjoy a fine seafood dinner overlooking the ocean

Day 10: Swakopmund

Overnight at a comfortable Hotel or Guesthouse
We are booked on an interesting boat cruise on the Walvis Bay. There are an interesting variety of sea animals and birds to be seen on this special adventure trip. A number of surprises await us

Day 11: Drive to the Erongo Mountains

Lodge amongst the massive granite boulders of the Erongo
A lovely area to walk, we may choose to do both a morning and a sunset guided walk. The local guides will share their in-depth knowledge of the African bush with us

Day 12: Drive to the Vingerklip

Lodge in the vicinity of the Ugab Terraces. An area that reminds one of the Marlboro landscapes of the USA, we enjoy the special view of this grand area from the sundowner deck of the lodge, after an enjoyable walk to the "rock finger"

Day 13: Drive through Damaraland to Twyfelfontien

Lodge at Twyfelfontien. We visit the special bushman engravings in the area (recently declared a World Heritage Site) and the geologically interesting organ pipes and burnt mountain

Day 14: Drive to Hobatere wildlife concession

Lodge on the western border of Etosha. A wildlife concession teeming with wildlife, privately managed. The lovely waterhole bordering the lodge draws the thirsty elephant herds and many other wild animals found here, including lions

Day 15: Etosha National Park

Okaukuejo Restcamp at the waterhole. With a special permit we travel through the vast western Etosha to Okaukuejo with its world famous waterhole that draws a huge variety of animals and birds

Day 16: Etosha National Park

Restcamp at Halali
We continue on our game drives on the many small roads in this park. A visit to the Pans edge and the waterholes Salvadore, Rietfontein and Nebrowni are a must. On the early morning game drive we have the greatest chance of finding those elusive Etosha lions and leopards

Day 17: Drive to Eastern Etosha

Lodge near Namutoni, eastern Etosha
Another day of wildlife viewing. We visit the vast Andoni Plains and the Fishers Pan, a haven for the many water birds found inland. We lunch at the historically interesting Namutoni Fort and depart for our special lodge late in the afternoon

Day 18: Drive via Tsumeb and Otavi to the Waterberg

Restcamp or lodge at the Waterberg
On the way we visit the mysteriously deep Otjikoto Lake. The Waterberg is a nature paradise, geologically interesting and famous for its big variety of trees and shrubs. There are a variety of interesting walks to choose from, including up to the top of the plateau

Day 19: Drive to Windhoek

To the highest lying lodge in Namibia
We travel via Okahandja and the wood carvers market to our lodge in the Khomas Hochland Mountains. We are booked on the Big Cats tour and take an interesting drive to visit the leopard, lion and cheetah that are at home in these hills

Day 20: Flight back home

Before we travel to the airport, we have the opportunity to visit the bustling and cosmopolitan African capital of Namibia, Windhoek. Historically interesting with many special shops and friendly people
